

1. **Baboosic Brook** - "the Twins"; flows from Baboosic lake through Amherst, Bedford, and Merrimack and merges into the Souhegan River where it converges with the Merrimack R.
2. **Twin Bridges Park** - purchased in 1927; includes frontage on Baboosic Brook, hiking trails, Kids Kove playground, MYA building, ballfield, picnic areas; named for 2 concrete footpath bridges spanning forked brook; remnants of the dam and raceway of an old grist mill can still be seen where the brook settles into a pool
3. **Adult Community Center** - was a school and then later the police station
4. **Public Library** - the Lowell Memorial Library was built 1924 with a donation from Bertha Gordon and Mrs. Mabel Haseltine in memory of their parents, Mr. & Mrs. Levi Lowell; the library was renovated and expanded in 1979
5. **Town Hall** - built 1872 for \$5000 when population was about 1060; later enlarged at cost of \$2000; incorporation of "Merrymac" (south of Souhegan River) in 1746; first town meeting was held somewhere in town in 1747 - Capt. John Cummings was chosen moderator and Phineas Underwood town clerk; Phineas, John Usher, & Zachariah Stearns were elected selectmen; incorporation of "Merrimack" (north of Souhegan R.) in 1750
6. **Congregational Church** - established in 1771; William Patten chosen as one of first 2 deacons; originally built with few comforts - only heat was from "foot stoves" which were filled with live coals; up until 1819, the town supported the church as a place not only for worship but as a meeting place as well
7. **Last Rest cemetery** - many prominent people buried in this private cemetery (Gages & Kittredges); town tomb built 1879
8. **Civil War Monument** - dedicated in 1892 to the 120 Merrimack citizens who died in the Civil War
9. **Schools** - Masticola Elementary, Masticola Middle School and Merrimack High School
10. **O'Gara Drive** - adjacent to the schools; contains lighted tennis courts, ball fields, outdoor skating rink, playground
11. **McConihe's Tavern** - built by Silas Roby in 1793 at the site where the library now stands; was frequented by people such as Walter Kittredge, composer of the popular song *Tenting on the Old Campground*; the building now stands across the street
12. **Merrimack Bicycle Shop** - built in 1700's; lower part used as store, upstairs Ayer's Hall used for meetings and social gatherings
13. **High House** - built by John McConihe in late 1700's
14. **Loop Road** - was part of old route 3; contains 3 historic homes built in the 1700's probably as quarters for workers at Issac Riddle's nail factory, tavern, and store
15. **Country Gourmet** - built in early 1800's; was once Riddles Tavern; a balanced colonial design; extinct pumpkin pine wainscoting
16. **Abbotts store** - built by Issac Riddle from bricks made at the brickyard at the Kaolin Farm site; oldest continuously operating store in Merrimack
17. **Souhegan River** - "Place of the plains"; an 18 mile tributary of the Merrimack that originates in New Ipswich and flows through the towns of Greenville, Wilton, Milford, Amherst, and Merrimack; this watershed encompasses 171 sq. miles
18. **Wildcat Falls Conservation Area** - an 80-acre parcel with hiking trails, spectacular waterfalls (where the Souhegan drops 83 feet), extensive wetlands and bogs, and unique geological formations
19. **Souhegan Dam & Mill Site** - built to provide hydropower for several mills at site now occupied by Harcros Chemical Co.; started with Issac Riddle's mill that manufactured cloth and nails in 1807; in 1906, the McElwain Shoe Company employed over 100 men to make boots for WW I soldiers; homes along Railroad Ave were built for immigrants who worked in the mill; first saw & grist mill in town was built by John Chamberlain in 1734 at what is now the site of the central fire station
20. **Fraser Square** - gift to the town in 1938 by International Shoe Co. (local tannery with home office in St. Louis, MO); named in memory of Duncan Fraser who was killed in World War II; the original memorial for Duncan was one of 2 trees planted in front of the public library which was cut down for the widening of the Baboosic Lake Rd - DW Highway intersection; the Chamber of Commerce operates a visitor information booth here (summer only)
21. **Railroad Depot** - Concord Railroad opened in 1842; an old picture of the Depot is located in the McDonalds restaurant on DW Highway
