REPORTS FOR OCTOBER 2014

The following is an overview of the activities performed by Equipment Maintenance and Highway Divisions in the Merrimack Public Works Department in October 2014:

Equipment Maintenance Division


- Completed 57 corrective maintenance repair orders and road service calls on Town vehicles, including:
 - Installed light bars on Code Enforcement vehicles
 - Replaced brakes for Fire Department engine E-4
 - o Installed new slip-in asphalt hot box for Highway dump truck H-31
 - Replaced tires for Parks & Recreation truck PR-1
 - Replaced front brakes for Police Department SUV MK9
- Performed 85 preventive maintenance repair orders
- Issued 10 repair orders to outside entities, including:
 - o Adjusted cabling for Fire Department ladder L-1
 - Replaced rear tires for Highway dump truck H-33
 - o Replaced or repaired tires for several Solid Waste trailers
 - Replaced transmission for Police Department cruiser 7


• Managed \$22,852 in equipment maintenance town-wide





Highway and Parks Maintenance Division

- Received or managed 115 work orders and service requests
 - Closed 100 work orders
 - 64% were open for less than 30 days
 - o 30% of pothole requests were closed less than 72 hours from first report



- Repaired large section of pavement at library parking lot
- Conducted seasonal drawdown of Naticook Lake two weeks early due to flooding concerns
- Trimmed trees and removed debris in preparation for P&R Halloween party at Wasserman Park
- Cleaned off roofs and gutters from several camp buildings at Wasserman Park
- Responded to street flooding in several locations due to heavy rains and clogged catch basin inlets
- Commenced fall cleanups of parks and cemeteries
- Mounted plows and spreaders to select vehicles
- Prepared ice rink area and made improvements at O'Gara Drive complex for winter use
- Conducted final closeout of facility inspections with NH Department of Labor



November 24, 2014

- Met with EPA regarding 5-year review of former NH Plating site
- Met with representative of Swamp, Inc. regarding invasive roadside plants
- Assisted Conservation Commission with town wide beaver management plan
- Completed annual roadside, drainage pond, and landfill mowing program
- Completed annual pavement marking program including town parking lots
- Completed annual catch basin cleaning program in compliance with MS4 permit
- Continued seasonal gravel road maintenance
