New Business: New Proposed Addition to Chapter 142 Matt began the discussion on ideas for changes and additions to Chapter 142 (Parks & Recreation Ordinances

- (a) Metal Detectors shall be permitted at all parks under the jurisdiction of the Parks & Recreation department, athletic fields, beaches, boat launches and playgrounds unless otherwise posted
- (b) Money or items found who value is in excess of \$5.00 shall be reported to the Parks & Recreation Department

## **DIGGING**

- (a) Digging shall be permitted on sand beaches with all resulting holes completely filled in. Digging holes to a depth greater than 12 inches shall not be permitted. No digging is permitted at Watson Park in any areas of the Park
- (b) Digging and other ground disturbances shall not be permitted on any athletic field or playgrounds
- (c) Any damage caused by the individual must be immediately reported to the Parks & Recreation Department and individual may be responsible for paying for any repairs
