- 1 Open Meeting/Introduction
- 2 Approval of minutes from:
  - June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2021
    - David Shaw made the motion to accept the June meeting minutes
    - o Tracy McGraw 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion
    - o 6-0-3 motion passed (Lon Woods, Christine Lavoie and Rick Greenier abstained)
- 3 Old Business Christine Lavoie
  - Update from Merrimack Dog Park
    - o Dog Park Fund Balance \$763.59
    - 15 Melanson CPA employees volunteered their time and looks great
    - Tracy McGraw stated that Mosquito Joe will have another treatment scheduled for Sunday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>
    - o Please don't leave water jugs behind when you leave as there is water at the park now
    - Donations for baggies for dog waste is always welcome
- 4 New Business Matt Casparius
  - 2021 2022 Goal Setting Discussion For next year's budget (FY 22 23) which means funding available July 1, 2022 next summer
    - Roof Replacement on Cabins 12, 3/4 and Boathouse with an initial estimate of \$15,800
    - Cabin 9/10 started leaking this year
      - Initially 9/10 was going to be torn down, but it's not now so we need to fix the roof so this will get revised to \$22,300 although may have to push one of these out a year
    - o MYA has requested irrigation to the Football practice Field at Wasserman Park.
      - \$62,000 is the starting estimate and Matt Casparius meet with a contractor to get a formal estimate in early September
  - FY 2023 2024

- Because of the coming replacement of our current docks at Wasserman Park, we are going to be able to utilize part of one of our docks to create a fishing dock outside of the swim area
- Tentative placeholder of \$750,000 for Athletic Field Development to build 2 fields at Greenfield Farms on Pearson Road
  - This still needs to be brought to Town Council

### FY 2024 – 2025

- o Replacement of Lights at Martel Field estimated cost of \$265,000 and are 20 years old
  - Part of the issue is that the existing lights are 20 feet shorter than they should be which creates a hazardous playing condition
  - New lights would be 60 feet and modern lighting would provide better coverage and visibility and reduce ambient light off the field

## FY 2025 – 2026

- Earmark of \$100,000 to refinish the 2500 square feet of unfinished space basement of the Function Hall
  - Create 4 to 5 good sized meeting rooms
- Additional items to consider adding to the budget:
  - Paving the Wasserman Park Roadway that is slowly deteriorating
  - Skateboard Park and eventually replacing the equipment
    - Currently on a year-to-year agreement with the School District
    - Discussions were held a few years ago about potential locations and the best option at the time was at near Bishop Field adjacent to the field
    - Wooden substructure that could not be disassembled and reassembled and to build a new park with modern equipment the estimate is \$85,000 - \$100,000
  - Lighting at the Dog Park so that the park could be used in the evening hours estimate TBD
  - Smaller parking lot above the basketball court specifically for events and activities going on in the Function Hall or the fields – estimate TBD
  - Beach renovation project deals with the left side of the beach to make it more accessible – estimate TBD
    - We have a 5-year window with the State with our existing permits before we have to start the process all over again

# 5 Director's Report - Matt Casparius

- Wasserman Park Beach Project Update
  - Last winter we put the beach project out to bid and the lowest bidder was almost double what are estimates were
  - Money left over from last year's fiscal budget that can go to this getting this project complete
- 2021 Summer Camp Update
  - Last day of camp will be Friday, August 20<sup>th</sup>
  - Biggest challenges this summer was hiring staff lifeguard pay rate increased from \$11.42 hour to \$15 an hour
  - 3 buildings have leaking roofs
  - 2 crushed septic system lines
  - o Ice machine broke last week
  - No cases of COVID so far
  - About 27 registrations short (or about \$6500) from estimated count months ago
- Report on Recent Community Special Events
  - Summer Concerts in the Park
    - Concerts went well and averaged about 140 people a week
  - Summer Movies in the Park
    - Currently average about 60 people
    - Police Dept asked do a 5<sup>th</sup> concert for National Night Out and will sponsor it
    - Friday, August 27<sup>th</sup> 7:30 pm at Wasserman Park Ferris Bueller's Day Off
    - Friday, September 17<sup>th</sup> 7:30 pm at Wasserman Park Raiders of the Lost Arc
