MERRIMACK, NH – (June 17, 2016) - The Town of Merrimack Public Works Department is hosting a *Local Concerns Meeting* for the Souhegan River Multi Use Path project on June 30, 2016 from 6:00 to 8:00 PM in the Matthew Thornton Room.

Merrimack was awarded a Federal Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant to construct 2,500 feet of multi-use trail that would connect Watson Park to the pedestrian bridge adjacent to the Merrill's Marauders bridge crossing the Souhegan River adjacent to the turnpike. The Local Concerns Meeting is the town's opportunity to obtain comments, questions, and concerns from the public with respect to the project.
