Caring for animals is not the only available training course. Bob McCabe received the soil sample results from Extension Service so he knows what the soil needs so he has been making garden preps. He is servicing all his equipment and putting linseedoil the wooden handles on his garden toolspreparing for spring.

Eber talked about insurance for farmers. There is a meeting up in Goffstown tomorrow at the Extension office regarding the apple and peach crops.

There is a pruning demonstration at Lastowka's Maple Gate Farm & Vineyard on March 31' 2012 from 9a.m. to 3p.m. They will be pruning fruit trees at Horse Hill Nature Preserve. Extension specialists George Hamilton and John Nute will be showing everyone how to do it.

Minutes of December 14, 2011 were read. Bob McCabe moved to accept them and Allen Lindahl seconded. Vote was 6-0-0.

John will be going up to Concord to the Farm Bureau Office on January 17th for a meeting of the State Agricultural Commissions to plan for a meeting for everyone to go to at the Farm and Forest Expo on February 3rd and 4th.

Allen moved to adjourn and Cindy seconded. 6-0-0. Adjourned at 8:44.
