REPORTS FOR JUNE 2014

The following is an overview of the activities performed by Equipment Maintenance and Highway Divisions in the Merrimack Public Works Department in June 2014:

Equipment Maintenance Division


- Completed 68 corrective maintenance repair orders and road service calls on Town vehicles, including:
 - o Installed light bars on Code Enforcement and Fire Department vehicles
 - o Replaced winch for Highway shoulder gravel conveyor
- Performed 89 preventive maintenance repair orders, including:
 - Mounted summer tires on several Police Department vehicles
- Issued 9 repair orders to outside entities, including:
 - Repaired leaking injectors for Fire Department engine E-2
 - Replaced battery charger for Fire Department vehicle C-1
 - Replaced several tires for Solid Waste tractor trailers
 - Repaired transmission shifting problem for Highway dump truck H-30


• Managed \$16,105 in equipment maintenance town-wide





Highway and Parks Maintenance Division

- Received or managed 131 work orders and service requests
 - Closed 94 work orders
 - 78% were open for less than 30 days
 - o 50% of pothole requests were closed less than 72 hours from first report



- Commenced annual roadside and landfill moving program
- Continued annual pavement marking program, to include installation of new highvisibility marking tape at various town center and school crosswalk areas
- Continued annual catch basin cleaning program in compliance with MS4 permit
- Completed annual street sweeping program in compliance with MS4 permit
- Continued seasonal gravel road maintenance
- Received annual road salt delivery
- Placed shoulder gravel support alongside newly paved roads
- Resurfaced sections of the skateboard park on O'Gara Drive
- Prepared Bise field for annual little league tournament
- Transplanted several donated trees at Watson Park

- Removed dangerous trees from Old Kings Road hiking path
- Began invasive Japanese Knotweed mitigation project at Seaverns Bridge
- Assisted with traffic control preparations for Ribfest
