completed by October 12<sup>th</sup>. How the benches would be affixed to the cement has not yet been determined. There are a few options; attach posts when cement is poured or pour the cement, allow to harden, and attach posts with angled brackets to cement.

Commissioner Tenhave spoke of another option whereby the cement is poured, and a threaded bolt dropped in before the cement hardens.

A brief discussion of how the cement would be mixed, transported, etc. ensued. The importance of keeping the cement away from the waterbody was relayed (always use clean bucket for water grab).

2. Scout Project - Brigham Parker of Troop 48 is presenting his project to work on the outdoor classroom at Grater Woods

Life Scout Brigham Parker stated his project to be the Outdoor Classroom located in Grater Woods directly behind the Merrimack Middle School. The Outdoor Classroom would replace the previous one, which has decayed over time. The project includes a teaching platform (8'x10'), which would be located in the area where the first bench was previously located, and 12 benches (2 rows of 6; 5' in length). Also considered is the last three benches on each side being 10' in length (15" in depth).

Materials and supplies would be sought from local merchants at a lower cost or donation.

The structures would be stabilized in cement (2' deep). Pressure treated lumber would be wrapped in tar paper (to keep from rotting) and placed in cement. Commissioner Tenhave questioned if the teaching platform would also be elevated off the ground and was informed it would be raised (put in cement).

Councilor Albert questioned the impetus for cementing the posts underground, noting the difficulty that would be experienced were a post to break, etc. Life Scout Parker responded he is uncertain how such a repair would occur; could potentially be drilled out. It was suggested the posts could be placed directly in the ground. Chair Perry commented on the previous benches having been removed and found in other locations. Vice Chair Caron stated agreement, if not cemented in place, they would be moved.

Life Scout Parker commented on having spoken with a contractor who works in the area and suggested wrapping the wood in tar paper and placing in cement.

Fundraising will include a pancake breakfast or soup and salad dinner at the troop's location in Nashua. There is also the potential for donations of material(s).

Vice Chair Caron commented when speaking with Life Scout Parker he brought something impactful to his attention; as this is not on school property, it is not just for the school children. It could be utilized by other groups, organizations, etc.

Chair Perry noted the project location is on Town owned property; therefore, the project will have to go before the Town Council for final approval.






# Proposed outdoor classroom






## Presenter's Platform







### Benches




## Footings/Concrete
