AGENDA REQUESTS/ ACCEPTANCE OF HIGHWAY SAFETY GRANTS FOR

2018-2019

The three agenda requests before the Town Council are grants from the NH Office of Highway Safety Agency for "Merrimack DWI Patrols", "Merrimack STEP Patrols", and "Merrimack Distracted Driving Patrols".

The Merrimack DWI Patrols grant is for the amount of \$7,970.00 and would fund 41 four hour patrols between the hours of 9 p.m. and 3 a.m. These patrols would focus on detecting DWIs and would predominately be held on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. We may schedule patrols around special events such as the Super Bowl and St. Patrick's Day, which are known events that are focused around alcohol. This past year we conducted 18 patrols which resulted in 11 arrests (2 for illegal possession/transportation of drugs, 9 for DWI) Officers stopped 267 vehicles during the patrols that ranges from speeding, red light and distracted driving violations.

The Merrimack Sustained Traffic Enforcement Patrols (STEP) grant is for the amount of \$12523. This would fund 65 four hour patrols between the hours of 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. We would also participate in 12 other patrols for four hours during the National Highway Safety "Operation Safe Commute" campaign and 2 patrols during the "Join the NH Clique" campaign. The STEP patrols would be utilized to focus on known trouble areas during the commuting hours, with the ultimate goal of reducing accidents and making our roadways safer for our residents and commuting public. These patrols could be used to focus on traffic controls devices that are not being followed, speeding in various areas, and/or school bus complaints, etc. This past year over 150 vehicles were stopped during the patrol which resulted in paper work issued from speeding to distracted driving.

The Merrimack Distracted Driving Patrols grant is for the amount of \$5665.00. This grant would fund 29 four hour patrols between the hours of 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. This grant would focus on patrols to deter distracted and negligent driving which may be caused from using a handheld electronic device, other distractions in the car, failing to clear snow from vehicle, etc. All three grants require 25% In Kind Match or Soft Match from the Police Department.
