Hi Eileen,

Girl Scouts Courtney Farrar & Mary Matheson from Troop 10144 would like to complete a project to benefit the Parks & Recreation Department to earn their Girl Scout Silver Award. The project will consist of two components. The first part of this project is to create and develop a trail map for the walking trails at Twin Bridge Park; which as far as I can tell have never been created before, but is something we get asked for all the time.

The second component to their project is to build and install bat boxes at Twin Bridge Park, Watson Park and Wasserman Park. Bats boxes are helpful to have in parks because they eat the mosquitos among other things.

The two girl scouts proposed these projects just a few weeks ago and I have met with them to discuss their proposals. They are hoping to complete the projects before school starts or at the latest in early September. The Parks & Recreation Committee doesn't meet in the summer and I didn't want to delay their project since the Town Council has to give the final approval anyway.

I feel that this is a valuable project and would recommend it to the Town Council for approval. I will of course inform the Parks & Recreation Committee of this proposal but do not anticipate any concerns.

· Our plan is to measure all the trails at twin bridges park. We will calculate the time to walk each trail and mount the trail length on to the posts that are at the end of each trail.


BROCHURE

Landing area- 5 x14 in
Side length- 2-3 in
Roof length- 30 in
Entrance- 1-2 in
Ceiling- 4 in
Predator guard- 1 in
Plywood 1-2 in x 3-4 in
