Bells of Peace: A World War I Remembrance Proclamation

A National Tolling of Bells to Honor Those Who Served

WHEREAS, a century ago 4.7 million American families sent their sons and daughters off to World War I;

WHEREAS, men and women from Merrimack, New Hampshire as well as all over the State of New Hampshire and the United States served selflessly and honorably in World War I;

WHEREAS, 116,516 Americans gave their lives in the war, and more than 200,000 were wounded;

WHEREAS, the tolling of bells is a traditional expression of honor and remembrance; and

WHEREAS, in November 2020 the world will commemorate the 102nd anniversary of the Armistice that ended the fighting in World War I at 11:00 A.M., November 11, 1918 -- the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month;

WHEREAS, on April 6, 2018, the United States World War I Centennial Commission called upon all Americans across the nation to toll bells in remembrance of those who served in World War I on Armistice Day as an annual event,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Merrimack, New Hampshire does hereby call upon all residents across our town to toll bells in remembrance of those who served in World War I at 11:00 a.m. on November 11, 2020 as part of this annual event. We urge the people and organizations of Merrimack to display the American flag as well as other public expressions of recognition and remembrance of our World War I veterans.
