COUNTER TERRORISM/ TRAINING AGENDA REQUEST

I would like to officially request the scheduling of an agenda item regarding grant acceptance (\$3,600.00) to the Merrimack Police Department for the purpose of conducting Counter Terrorism and Active Shooter training for our Special Response Team (SRT). The New Hampshire Department of Safety and Division of Homeland Security & Emergency Management, has approved this grant.

The purpose of this training is to improve our response and tactics when responding to an active shooter event or terrorist threat where the perpetrator has fled into a wooded area. Due to the topography throughout New England and more specifically Merrimack, the potential for a domestic terrorist or active shooter to flee into the vast mountains and woodland terrain is great, putting both law enforcement and the community at great risk while in pursuit. As most of our Special Response Team training thus far has focused mainly on responses to active shooter or terrorist threats within a contained building or area, this training will familiarize our tactical officers with movement techniques, formations, and officer down scenarios in a woodland or rural environment while in pursuit of an active shooter or domestic terrorist.

This training will be conducted over a 5-day period of time at Long Range Ranch, LLC in Lyndeborough, NH. The training will provide individual and agency awareness of the challenges, limitations, equipment, skills, and fitness required to perform tactical movement operations in this environment. The training will emphasize team movement in rough terrain, reacting to enemy contact, formation and movement techniques based on different scenarios. As our team is composed of supervisors, master patrolman and patrolman, we feel this training will also aid officers in their everyday patrol capacity, as first responders dealing with this type of critical incident.
