The agenda request before the Town Council is to accept a donation of \$10,200 from an anonymous donor to be utilized to start a comfort dog program at the Merrimack Police Department. Comfort dogs are used for many different roles at a police department. These roles include providing comfort for people during times of crisis, reducing anxiety during investigations to increase communications with officers, provide aid and comfort individuals and the community that is impacted by violence, tragedy or traumatic events. Patrol Officer Amanda Groves will be the comfort dog handler and will remain in the patrol division. She is also a member of our newly formed Critical Incident Stress Management team. The comfort dog will be with Officer Groves and respond to calls for service just as she does. The comfort dog can be utilized at other officers calls as well if they believe it could help. We will be attempting to obtain a dog from Boonefield Labradors, who provides a lab for free to police departments.

We are not able to provide a car specifically for the comfort dog so we were planning on outfitting one of our patrol cars with a 1/3 prisoner 2/3 K9 rear cage. This allows us to transport the comfort dog, but also still utilize it for prisoner transports. It further allows us to utilize the car on different shifts when Officer Groves and the dog are not working. The cost of this cage is our largest expense. It is also equipped with a cooling and paging system to alert for temperature spikes. The total cost with install is \$7,300.

Additional costs would include:

6 week Basic Obedience Training - \$300

6 week Intermediate Course - \$300

AKC Canine Good Citizen Course – \$300

Misc Expenses (Vet, equipment, etc.) - \$2,000 Est. yearly cost (obtained from Goffstown PD)

Total first year startup cost - \$10,200

We are hopeful that we would be able to obtain community donations to support the program in the future. If you have any questions, please let me know.
