RE: HIGHWAY SAFETY EQUIPMENT REIMBURSEMENT GRANT

The Merrimack Police Department is transitioning to a new records management system moving from our current system, Microsystems-Crimetrack, to a management system from CSI Technology Group which will offer us a more efficient way to manage our records. The new CSI system is currently scheduled to be implemented in June of this year.

The new system gives officers the ability to electronically produce motor vehicle enforcement paperwork, warnings, summons and defective equipment paperwork roadside. This is a scanning based system where the officers scan an operator's license to start the paperwork process. Currently these items are hand written by the officer. It will also give officers the ability to scan documents including license, motor vehicle registrations, etc. to more efficiently document accident reports. This new method will be more efficient and safe for officers on the road.

This new technology requires the purchase of printers to be mounted in the officer's vehicles to be able to produce the paperwork roadside. We have eleven vehicles that will need to be outfitted with these new printers. This also requires the purchase of mounting kits, adapter plates and would require professional installation. We have a quote for the equipment from Glacier Computer for \$10,226.00. The grant is a 100% reimbursement for the printers which also requires a 25% in-kind match. Our match will be the cost of the installation.

We are also purchasing a mobile data terminal which will be installed in our K9 officer's vehicle. This vehicle currently does not have an MDT in it. We have a quote

on file from Advanced Electronics Design Inc. for \$3,499.48 which would cover the lap top purchase, mounting equipment as well as installation. This grant for the MDT is covered at 50% (up to \$1,500) by the state and will total \$1,500 in reimbursement. We will cover the remaining balance.

In November of 2021 we applied for an equipment reimbursement grant from New Hampshire Office of Highway Safety for the equipment listed above. We received word in March of this year that the grant application we submitted to the state has been approved. We have been awarded a grant from the New Hampshire Office of Highway Safety in the amount of \$11,715.33 to help cover all related costs. We are asking the Council to allow the town to accept this grant.

eCrash Equipment

X Printer, Bar Code Scanner, GPS Receiver Equipment

- A reimbursable unit includes the following three items:
 - 1. Compatible Printer w/Mobile Adapter Kit/Printer Mount and Adapter Plate
 - 2. Compatible Bar Code Scanner
 - 3. Compatible USB GPS Receiver
- eCrash equipment cannot exceed the amount of \$1,440.00 per unit to include shipping.
- Purchased units must be installed within 90 days of receiving equipment.
- Law Enforcement agencies who are participating in this program are expected to begin submitting
 electronic crash reports to the Division of Motor Vehicles within 180 days of receiving equipment.

X Mobile Data Terminal Equipment

- A reimbursable unit includes the following two items:
 - 1. Laptop OHS will reimburse 50% up to \$1,500 for each laptop awarded
 - 2. Docking Station/Mounting Hardware/Stand OHS will reimburse 50% up to \$500 for docking station/mounting hardware/stand
- Only cruisers that are <u>primarily</u> (used 50% of the time for enforcement efforts) used for citation, crash reporting and have connectivity to the state system will be considered eligible for this E-Crash equipment grant.
- Purchased units must be installed within 90 days of receiving equipment.
- Law Enforcement agencies who are participating in this program are expected to begin submitting electronic crash reports to the Division of Motor Vehicles within 180 days of receiving equipment.
- Equipment Reimbursements must be submitted within the quarter in which the equipment is purchased.

NOTE: Does not include the purchase of equipment outside the scope of the above mentioned equipment.
