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19 **Public Hearing**

1. Public Hearing - Group Petition to Add a Warrant Article Resolution to the 2021 Town Meeting 20

- 21 Warrant
- 22 Submitted by Group Petition Signer Mary Beth Raven
- 23 The Town Council held a public hearing to receive public input on a Group Petition received, pursuant to
- 24 Charter Article 10-1, B. The petition is to add a Warrant Article Resolution to the 2021 Town Meeting
- 25 Warrant to see if the Town will vote to urge that the New Hampshire General Court, which is obligated to
- 26 redraw the maps of political districts within the state following the federal census, will ensure fair and
- effective representation of New Hampshire voters without gerrymandering. Additionally, these voters ask 27
- the Town of Merrimack to urge the NH General Court to carry out the redistricting in a fair and transparent 28
- 29 way through public meetings, not to favor a particular political party, to include communities of interest, and to minimize multi-seat districts.
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31 Assistant Town Manager / Finance Director Paul Micali advised the Town Council that the group petition 32 received the signatures of 79 registered voters. He stated that the Town Council must make a decision 33 34 tonight on this item because the warrant must be posted Monday February 22, 2021. He explained the three

35 actions the Town Council could take; first would be take no action, second is to move the petition to the ballot and the third is to create an ordinance. Mary Beth Raven stated that this is a non-binding resolution to 36 be sent to state officials. She stated that the resolution asks for fairness, transparency and without political 37 38 favoritism. She stated the resolution requests that the mapping process be done in public meetings. The

39 request states that towns larger than 3,300 citizens be given their own state representative districts. Mary Beth Raven explained that resolution requests that the governing body communicate the Town's wishes in 40 writing to state and federal delegations. Mary Beth Raven informed the Town Council that the warrant 41 article is volunteer driven and can be found in 103 town meeting and SB2 towns around the state. She 42 43 stressed that the key to inclusion is transparency.

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Chairman Koenig opened the public hearing at 7:12 pm

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Chairman Koenig closed the public hearing at 7:13 pm

1 2 Councilor Harrington asked the other members of the Town Council what would be a reason that they would 3 not move this article to the warrant. Councilor Rothhaus explained that in the past petition warrant articles 4 have come the Town Council. He stated that when it moved by the Town Council to the warrant it lends to the credibility of the warrant article. He is hesitant to support an article that could have a political agenda. 5 He spoke in favor of the process where 500 or more citizens support the article moving the article to the 6 warrant. Vice Chair Boyd stated that in reading the ordinance it is the Town Council's responsibility to 7 8 decide the merit of the article that warrants the consideration of the voters. He believes this article does have merit and should be considered by the voters. Assistant Town Manager / Finance Director Paul Micali 9 advised the Town Council that there would not be a Town Council recommendation on this article. He 10 11 stated that the warrant article has language that informs the voters that it is a citizens petition warrant article. Chairman Koenig questioned why the Town Council would send the letter since it is the voters of Merrimack 12 13 who will decide. He asked for clarification on the language that refers to minimizing multi-seat districts. 14 Mary Beth Raven agreed that the language could be better phrased as Merrimack is a multi-seat district. She stated that the language was referring to districts that cross or combine towns. Vice Chair Boyd stated that it 15 16 should reflect floterial and not multi-seat. Councilor Harrington agrees that the letter should not come from 17 the Town Council. Assistant Town Manager / Finance Director Paul Micali advised the Town Council that adjustments as mentioned can be done only at the deliberative session. He suggested that Mary Beth Raven 18 19 contact the Town Moderator Lynn Christenson for guidance on amending the petition warrant article.

21 <u>MOTION</u> made by Councilor Harrington and seconded by Vice Chair Boyd to move Warrant Article 22 Resolution to the 2021 Town Meeting Warrant. <u>MOTION CARRIES 3-1-0</u> Councilor Rothhaus voted 23 in the negative and Councilor Woods present

Chairman Koenig reiterated his concerns about the appearance of a partisan effort. He explained why he
