

Town Manager's Update

Announcements

- The Nashua Regional Planning Commission's "Hazardous Household Waste Collection" event is happening again this Saturday, May 7 at 289 South St. in Milford. You can watch a video on THE TOWN OF MERRIMACK'S Facebook page about the event. Merrimack Residents are encouraged to attend, as we are an NRPC participating community. Note: There is a small fee to safely dispose of the items.

- The Merrimack Wastewater Treatment Plant will be closed to the public and septage/sludge/compost haulers beginning at 11:00am on Friday, May 20th thru Sunday, May 22nd. The closure is required to allow our contractor to trench across the driveway to the facility to install underground utility banks, supported with concrete. The Wastewater Treatment Plant will open on May 23rd (Monday) at 7:00am. Wastewater staff made arrangements to allow septage haulers to take septage normally received at the Merrimack Wastewater Treatment Plant to other local facilities. A letter detailing the specifics will be sent to all septage haulers. Campers and RVs are asked to empty their units at another facility or wait until the facility reopens.

Town Manager's Report

- The Street Sweeping Program entered Zone 5 this week. Zone 6 is anticipated to begin next week and the program is expected to be completed by the end of May.

- Line striping is scheduled for the first week of June. The Line Striping Program is a contracted service managed by the Highway Division that stripes the long yellow and white lines on the Town roads. Work is completed over night to avoid conflicts with traffic.

- Final paving began on Baboosic Lake Road and Joppa Extension today. The top course of pavement for Amherst Road will be paved on Friday May 6th and Naticook Road will be paved on Monday, May 9th. Shoulder work began on Turkey Hill Road today; Once shoulder work is completed then the road will receive the final course of pavement. Some of the driveways and intersections will be completed after the main paving is complete.

- The Crack Sealing program is scheduled to be completed tomorrow. The program extended the life of the existing pavement on 36 roads Town-wide.
