

Tennessee Gas Pipeline Public Information Sessions - December 2015 -

Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company, L.L.C. (TGP) will hold public information sessions to present information regarding the Application for a Certificate of Site and Facility (Application) to be filed with the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Commission (SEC), for the construction of a new natural gas transmission line and compressor station in southern New Hampshire, which is part of the Market Path Component of TGP's Northeast Energy Direct (NED) Project. TGP is planning to file its Application with the SEC in the near future.
